We are busy planning a full schedule for the time there and look forward to a great time in that glorious part of the world. It has been such a privilege to work with SWAY in supporting families over the past 5 years. I have watched and listened to so many parents facing difficult dilemmas and decisions and have been inspired by their resilience to find ways to overcome their problems.

I have experienced great joy and sadness, laughter and tears, often overwhelmed with the way I've been welcomed into people's lives and homes. It has been a job of such variety, each week never the same as the last. I've attended meetings at schools, sat on Children's Services case reviews, IOW Council Early Help commissioning meetings, Court cases, benefit reviews and applications, appointments at dentists, doctors and hospital to name a few, but mostly I've been a listening ear with a cup of tea in hand!

My weekly team meeting with other SWAY staff has been an invaluable support for me. Often, I would be commandeered by Andy to 'volunteer' to help at activities, which I've thoroughly enjoyed. The 'Zoom cooking' or The Box Project has been the highlight of the past year. I have had such pleasure watching our young people and families especially in the last session, confidently cooking without much instruction. I hope this continues and that SWAY continues to invest in the much-needed support for the families of the South Wight.

Firstly, there is our Corf Camp on 20th – 22nd May. This is the first camp since 2019 and we are very excited for this weekend.
